## **Canon Garland Memorial Society Incorporated**

**WELCOME to the website of the Canon Garland Memorial Society Incorporated (the “CGMS”), a community-based, not-for-profit group established in Brisbane, Queensland, Australia, on a volunteer basis.**

On Friday, 22 April 2016, *Canon Garland Memorial - ANZAC Day Origins* was officially unveiled, dedicated and handed over to the People of the City of Brisbane in a ceremony at Brisbane’s Kangaroo Point Cliffs Park, heralding Centenary of ANZAC Day commemorations.

Having achieved the primary mission of building the Memorial, the Society has considered that, given the public benefit of Canon Garland's broad range of community involvement, there was significant merit in broadening the Society's focus to:

- Increase public awareness about the Memorial and the Origins of ANZAC Day.
- Highlight Canon Garland's lifetime of service to the community and how it fostered social cohesion in Australia.

The Society is now working on a new project which focuses on the above objectives.

The Canon Garland Memorial Society Incorporated is a charitable organisation registered with the Australian Government's Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission (the "ACNC") and, as such, is permitted to display the *ACNC tick*.

In 1924 the Reverend Canon David John Garland was described by Queensland's Acting Premier, William Neal Gillies, as "the life and soul of [ANZAC Day Commemoration Committee](#)". **CANON DAVID JOHN GARLAND, OBE**  
 Dublin, 1864 Arrived Australia 1886 Died Brisbane, 1957  
 'Architect of ANZAC Day'

Presented a first ANZAC Day Service from 1901 onwards including the wreath, solemn mass, the obeisance, the National Anthem and the Hymn 'The Church was moved to Zealand and Great Britain'. The organizational finesse influenced the building of War's Shrine of Remembrance and Shrine of Sacrifice on Towering Centenary, and the ANZAC Shrine of Remembrance.

**Clergyman and Servant of the Soldiers**

As a Deacon in New South Wales, then as a Priest in Warrumbidgee and in Queensland where he instructed in Government schools, and independent workers. During the last 20 years he was engaged in Brisbane. In 1915 he organized chaplaincy services in Palestine. All recruits based in Brisbane were chaplains during ANZAC troops in the Middle East where he ministered eight regiments of soldiers' Church of England help society that he founded. At home he set up homes for convalescing public health, immigration schemes and school instruction. This work led to his election from Parish of Ithaca in Brisbane, centred on St. Barnabas' Church End Hill, from 1921 to 1925.
